Coursework: Thesis Option: 42 units; Exam Option: 45 units. Normally, only 3.0 unit courses are accepted. In both tracks, no more than 18 units total may come from introductory (1000) level courses. At least two courses must be taken at the advanced (4000) level.

Certain advanced-level language courses designed to equip MA students for future research, however, may be counted as electives in some circumstances. Students must petition the Academic Dean for approval of such coursework as graduate electives.
