


# Call for Papers

## Person, Soul & Consciousness: Philosophical and Theological Perspectives

*July 12-15, 2017, Berkeley, California*

This colloquium, part of an ongoing triennial series on the intersection between philosophy and theology, seeks to continue the venerable Dominican tradition of bringing together philosophers and theologians to explore questions of contemporary importance. This colloquium's particular theme is the human person in his or her full intellectual, spiritual, and embodied existence: How do philosophical insights into the human person illumine topics within theology, and how do recent developments in theology present challenges or opportunities for philosophical research into consciousness, person, and the soul?

Proposals will be accepted for presentations that are no more than 30 minutes in length; they should pertain to the topic of the human person, considered from a philosophical and/or theological perspective. A complete proposal should consist of a title, a 300-word abstract, the presenter's name, degrees earned, institutional and departmental affiliation, and contact information (including an email address). Proposals submitted by graduate students are warmly encouraged, but should include the name of a sponsoring faculty member. **Proposals must be received by Wednesday, March 15, 2017, by email (jgable@dspt.edu).** Notification of the proposal's acceptance will be returned by April 1, 2017. Plenary session papers and other selected submissions will be published in *Nova et Vetera*.

### \$500 award for the best graduate student submission:

A stipend of \$500 will be awarded to the outstanding graduate student paper of the colloquium, to be selected by the Program Committee. In order to be considered for the award, a completed paper (not just an abstract) must be submitted by **March 15, 2017**. A reduced registration fee is available for graduate students.
