**COURSE DESCRIPTION**: In this course, we will explore the criteria for a homily imposed by the liturgical celebration of the sacraments. Each Sacrament will be treated as to the requirements that it places on the preacher so that the homily is full accord with Catholic liturgical practices. We will also consider what is required in preaching in non-liturgical settings such as retreats, days of recollection, etc.

**PHILOSOPHY**: The primary concern of this course is that the student studies, thinks and prays so as to deepen his or her personal appreciation for the act of liturgical preaching. The student is expected to sincerely try to absorb and reflect on what is offered in this course and apply it to their own act of preaching.

**COURSE GOALS**: The goal of this course is to enable the student to preach appropriately and effectively in the various liturgical celebrations of the Catholic Church and to use the homily on the assigned Scriptural text to unify and direct the sacramental and liturgical celebration. In pursuing this end, the student will investigate the place and function of the proclamation of Scripture and preaching in liturgical celebrations and its theological foundations. Finally, the student will be asked to grasp the specific demands the various liturgical and sacramental celebrations make on the development of the homily and its presentation in the celebration.

Because of the variations in enrollment and the differing needs of the students, this syllabus may be amended in response to the concrete needs of the students. This Syllabus is provisional!

**FORMAT**: Lecture and practicum. Students will be expected to preach a 5 minute or less homily for each sacrament.

**INTENDED AUDIENCE**: This course is intended for clerical students, male or female but lay students are also invited to attend and participate.

### **EXPECTATIONS AND ASSIGNMENTS:**

- 1. During the course the student will develop and deliver at least seven liturgical homilies. The text of the homily will be due the day before its presentation.
- 2. After the delivery of each homily, the class will critique the homily and its appropriateness to the liturgical celebration in a positive way so as to help the homilist improve his or her preaching skills.
- 3. To assist the students in developing their liturgical preaching skills, a lecture on one or more aspects of liturgical preaching and its

theology/spirituality will be delivered and then this discussed in the following class.

- 4. When required, one or more short research papers may be assigned.
- 5. The final grade will depend upon the effort made by the student to improve their liturgical preaching skills, class participation and the required research papers.

**REQUIREMENTS**: (1) Attendance, (2) proclamation of Scripture (3) preaching of several 5 minute homilies, (4) and a critique of other students work and homilies.

- 1. Because the student is needed not only to present their own work and critique the work of others, absence for more than 3 classes makes them ineligible for a grade for the course. (10% of grade)
- 2. Before every homily, the student will be required to proclaim the text of Scripture upon with it is based. (30% of grade)
- 3. During the course, each student will be expected to prepare and preach several 5 min homilies based on a specific text of Scripture for a sacramental celebration. (50% of grade)
- 4. Every student will be expectred to critique the preaching of the other students ... BUT NOT IN ORDER TO TEAR DOWN OR EMBARRESS THE PREACHER BUT TO POINT OUT WAYS IN WHICH THE PREACHER CAN IMPROVE AND GROW! (10% of grade)

GRADES: A summary of grade composition is given in the following table:

- 1. Attendance: 10%
- 2. Proclamation of Scripture: 30%
- 3. Preaching of homilies 50%
- 4. Critique of other students work 10%

**Total 100%** 

Grading Scale: A=100, A-=97, B+=93, B=90, B-=87, C+=83, C=80, C-=77, D+=73, D=70, F=0. No late work of any kind will be accepted (except, at my discretion, for very serious reasons).

Grading of papers and presentations, proclamations and homilies and critiques are assigned according to the following criteria:

- A. Demonstration of a clear and positive understanding to the elements of liturgical preaching.
- B. Demonstration of a clear grasp of the 'grace of the text of Scripture' as it relates to the concrete need and condition of the people addressed within the requirements of the liturgical celebration.
- C. Demonstration of a positive effort to improve their understanding of the requirements that each sacrament preaching and their ability to prepare and deliver a 5 minute homily.

**Practicum**: Discuss Scripture as a primary way of making Jesus present in worship

Preach the assigned homily followed by a class critique

**Lecture**: Eucharist, integration of texts

**Assignment**: Read and study: USNCCB, "Fulfilled in your hearing: Homily in the

Sunday Assembly"

Prepare two Scriptural texts from lectionary for proclamation and write a homily for it.

#### Session 05: October 05, 2018

**Practicum**: Discuss the relevance and practicality of "Fulfilled in your hearing:

Homily in the Sunday Assembly"

Preach the assigned homily followed by a class critique

**Lecture**: Homily and the unification and meaning of the Eucharist

**Assignment**: Read and study USCCB, "Preaching the Mystery of Faith, the Sunday homily"

Prepare the Scriptural text from the lectionary for proclamation and write a homily for it with appropriate introductions at the beginning of Mass, before the penitential act, the prayer of the faithful, before the kiss of peace and the dismissal.

write a homily for it.
